Douglas County Chamber Youth Leadership Douglas Mentor Program

Youth Leadership Douglas is a leadership training program grounded in community awareness, community service and in developing your personal potential to lead.

About the Youth Leadership Douglas Mentor Program

Leadership is more than just raw talent and determination. While a portion of great leadership is aptitude, a great deal of what it takes to be a leader is skill based and can be learned. Selected YLD Graduates will be paired with a community leader to facilitate conversation, guidance, and motivation during their senior year.

The Youth Leadership Douglas Mentor Program is highly interactive which permits participants to utilize their mentors for personal and professional growth. The Youth Leadership Douglas goals are:

- To provide opportunities for participants to develop an understanding of the meaning and responsibilities of personal, organizational and community leadership.
- To produce ethical leaders committed to active community involvement.

Program Description & Requirements

Current seniors from any Douglas County high school (both public and private) who have completed the YLD Mentor Program during their junior year are eligible to apply. The Youth Leadership Douglas Mentor Program will take place during the student's senior year.

The Youth Leadership Douglas Mentor Program will adhere to the following meeting schedule:

The YLD Mentor Program is a four-month commitment. Mandatory meeting dates include:

- Orientation/Kick-Off July 25, 2017 from 4-5 p.m.
- Mid-Program meeting October 24, 2017 from 4-5 p.m.
- End of Program meeting December 12, 2017 from 4-5 p.m.
- Recognition Ceremony January 25, 2018 from 5-6 p.m.

During the four-month period, mentors and mentees are requested to:

- Follow the guidelines set in the YLD Mentor Program Handbook
- Meet at least three times outside of the three scheduled Mentorship events
- Complete book study activities and other assignments
- Attend Chamber business and networking events together as schedules permit

Expectations

- 100 % Attendance is mandatory.
 If a student cannot commit to attending ALL the meetings, application is not encouraged.
- YLD Mentor Program participants must coordinate transportation to and from YLD Mentor Program classes.
- All program communication is done electronically. Each student is required to set up an email account and join the Remind text messaging program in order to maintain correspondence with the group.
- Communication regarding the program must be done through the student, not the parent/guardian of the student.

Program Fee

The fee to participate in the program is \$100, which includes all class expenses. Partial scholarships are available with a written request for funding detailing reasons for financial assistance.
