



2019 Legislative Update

Legislative Days 8-11

The Legislature completed legislative day 11 on Friday, February 8. The legislature passed an adjournment resolution which sets the calendar for the remainder of the 40-day session. Crossover day is set for Thursday, March 7 and Sine Die is set for Tuesday, April 2. You can review the full legislative schedule [here](#).

Few pieces of legislation passed last week, with the major focus being on the budget. The House passed its version of the [FY19 supplemental budget](#) on Friday. The bill now moves to the Senate and it is expected to be finalized soon. The Senate passed [SR 19](#) by Senator Brandon Beach which calls for strategic study, planning and coordination for a system of freight, innovation and logistics investment projects.

The RBC held our Board meeting at the Capitol last week. We were honored to have Governor Brian Kemp and Commissioner Pat Wilson come speak to our group.
