What is a TAD?

A Tax Allocation District (TAD) is a tool for redevelopment in a specific area. The Redevelopment Powers Law gives Douglas County the ability to create TADs.

What does a TAD do for a city or a county?

- Promotes growth in specific areas
- Creates employment opportunities
- Overcomes obstacles to redevelopment

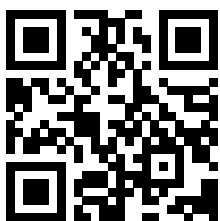
What types of projects can TAD funds support?

The renovation rehabilitation, reconstruction, remodeling, repair, demolition, alteration or expansion of:

- Public infrastructure;
- Existing buildings or other facilities;
- A variety of housing options;
- Public art as well as art and cultural facilities;
- Facilities for the improvement of pedestrian access and safety; and others

Does a TAD raise property taxes?

No. A TAD does not increase property taxes.
